# Mold delays traditional spring opening



he Post Falls Museum has delayed its traditional late May opening due to the presence of mold in the base-

ment.

The society board of directors is currently working with city staff and area environmental contractors to analyze the mold and put a plan together to remove it and keep it from returning. At press time, several area firms have visited and offered estimates.

We're disappointed not to have our traditional opening, but we want to make sure we focus on the health and safety of our volunteers and guests. Although some amount of moisture is common, especially in older buildings, a volunteer discovered significant amounts of mold in the basement this spring. She felt concerned and alerted others. The city advised keeping the building closed to the public until conditions change.

It is currently not known what items may be affected: the basement is mostly used for storage, so there's a range of everything from Christmas decorations to commemorative steins from past Oktoberfests.

The building is owned by the City of Post Falls but its use is licensed to the Post

Falls Historical Society which has agreed to maintain the interior.

Even if the museum is temporarily closed, the society plans to continue its ongoing mission of historic preservation and community outreach. This includes a 100-year birthday celebration for the Chapin Building July 6 in the courtyard outside City Hall and our ice cream social July 8. If the Chapin Building is fully open at that point, the museum staff will offer tours.

he Idaho State Historical Society presented Kim Brown with its Esto Perpetua award in early June for her historical preservation efforts spanning nearly 40 years.

Kim has been an active member and held leadership positions in the Post Falls Historical Society as well as other community organizations such as the Kootenai County Historic Preservation Commissions, Daughters of the American Revolution, and Toastmasters International.

She was one of two recipients from our region to receive the impressive honor for 2023. Richard Caron from Wallace was the other.

Her award was presented in Boise by Don Pischner, a Post Falls resident and the ISHS District 1 Trustee. In her acceptance, she thanked all ister. This effort has included putting together a those who put the application together and

wrote letters of recommendation.

Kim has held every officer position in the Post Falls Historical Society and has been instrumental in its growth and success. This included everything from working to raise money to repair a damaged statue of John Mullan to working with Ponderosa Elementary students to create a series of historic figures and a history walk.

She worked closely with the Coeur d'Alene Tribe to ensure their heritage is reflected in the community. She also was involved in efforts to find a permanent location for the museum.

Last year, she was society board president but stepped down to focus on the application to add the Chapin building to the National Historic Reg-100-year community birthday party in July.
